Board Meeting Highlights – May 11, 2021 From Our Advisors...

Wendy shared that Contracts/Agreements between NNMNs and any organization or person for any reason (farmer's markets, fairs, venues for programs, speakers, etc.) MUST NOT BE SIGNED BY INDIVIDUALS – EVER! All such paperwork *must be given to an advisor* who will send it for review and authorization by the VT legal department. This is for our protection, so that we are not held liable for anything for any reason. This process will take time, though.

Please allow at least two weeks for the application to be approved BEFORE advertising for the event begins. Plan ahead!

This has ALWAYS been the VMN policy, and we all need to be aware of it.

COVID Updates

In spite of the vaccination progress being made in our state and nation, we are not out of the Covid woods quite yet. New guidelines have been received for the Extension programs. The ones directly related to us are:

- Indoor and Outdoor programs: group size 50% occupancy of the event space with 6' social distancing maintained.
- ALL program participants, indoors and outdoors, youth and adult, are required to wear appropriate face covering/masks.
 - Event checklist must be completed, signed, and returned to an advisor.



Special July Program Meeting!

Ah, the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer! We all enjoy our summertime activities, but this year the Northern Neck Master Naturalists will be treated to a special program on HERPS! Our Program Chair, Kevin, has arranged for "The Capitol Naturalist," Alonso Abugattas, to speak to us (via Zoom) on July 13, 2021. Alonso is a well-known metropolitan DC naturalist, environmental educator, and storyteller while earning a real living as the Natural Resources Manager for Arlington County Parks, VA. He has been trained as a master gardener and was instrumental in helping to start and subsequently teach for two Virginia Master Naturalist chapters in Northern Virginia. He is a co-founder of the Washington Area Butterfly Club, held several offices, including president, for the Potowmack Chapter of the Virginia Native Plant Society, and authored a book on The Reptiles and Amphibians of the Washington, DC, Metropolitan Area. Most outstanding is his personal blog and Facebook group, "Capital Naturalist," both of which contain an immense amount of natural history information. He has won many awards for his natural history knowledge and skills and is an all-around great guy!



2021 BASIC TRAINING COURSE COMING SOON!

The Northern Neck Master Naturalist BTC will begin August 3 and continue through November 16. The classes will be conducted via Zoom, 6:30-9:00 pm. Field experiences will take place outdoors.

At this time, speakers and field experiences are being confirmed. As many of you realize from previous BTCs, it takes a LOT of MEMBERS to volunteer their assistance to provide the trainees with the experiences they deserve. Many have already stepped forward to volunteer as **mentors**. We're so grateful for all of you. We do anticipate needing a few more, however; so if you would like to help a future master naturalist by serving in this role, please contact our mentor chair, Alice Stieve (alice.stieve@me.com).

Another area in need of NNMNs is the field work. There are five field experiences planned (on Saturdays), and three of those will require leaders in a specific topic area. We plan to have small groups of students with a topic leader (not necessarily an "expert", but a very knowledgeable and passionate "amateur") and a facilitator (to make sure everyone has what they need, is engaging with the topic, and doesn't get left on the trail). Don't be shy about volunteering in your area of expertise; if you don't volunteer yourself, one of your friends may recommend you anyway! And if you don't feel competent enough to be the leader, please offer to be the facilitator for a group. 
