




Goal: To creatively plan and implement the Chapter's activities in order to continue fulfilling our mission within the constraints of the Covid pandemic

All Board Meetings and General Meetings were held via Zoom in 2021



- The new Board members were to assume their duties immediately.
- November 18 The Executive Board met, masked & socially distanced, to begin planning for the 2021 year. This group approved the committee chairs as recommended by the Nominating Committee and approved the expenditure for VMN masks for all members.
- December 8 The full Board met via Zoom to look at the year ahead. Since we could not meet indoors, Anne Clewell, Hospitality Chair, prepared a virtual holiday service and social activity, "The Winter Nature Challenge."








Two new volunteer Activities were approved by the Board:

- Caterpillars Count! an arthropod monitoring program sponsored by
- Spotted Lanternfly Monitoring (the spotted lanternfly is an invasive insect wreaking havoc in fruit orchards and vineyards)



NO Board or General Meetings were held in April.

Our chapter received packets of pollinator seeds from the VA Turf Grass Council. These were distributed to members who requested them.

- The Continuing Ed Committee has a newly revised application form for Continuing Ed credits. There are revised Guidelines for CE Credit approval, allowing for "Self Approval" of Sponsoring and Partner Agency programs if they meet the Mission Statement of the Virginia Master Naturalists and build upon topics covered in the Basic Training Course.

This is considered "agricultural", and the honeybee is non-native, so it is not an approved volunteer activity for members of our chapter and cannot be counted towards hours. Any NNMNs working with honeybees at state parks or other public places should not identify themselves as Northern Neck Master Naturalists.

The Capital Naturalist, Alonso Abugattas, provided our program on "Herps."



The Chapter Operating Handbook was updated by the Executive Committee and approved by the Board.

New Activiies Approved by the Board:

- The Westmoreland Oyster Gardening Project was approved for volunteer hours.
 - GLOBE is a citizen science project that uses cloud images to supplement NOAA and NASA satellite data. A "lead" person is needed for our chapter.
